Replant History

- ★ 1990 - Scott Hantman develops idea of Aggie Replant
- ★ 1991 - First Replant Day held in the spring
- ★ 1995 - Replant Day held in honor of Scott Hantman
- ★ 2001 - Replant Day is moved to the fall semester
- ★ 2012 - Replant traveled to Bastrop State Park
- ★ 2015 - Trees for The Blanco event held for first time, 1600 seedlings planted



Replant History



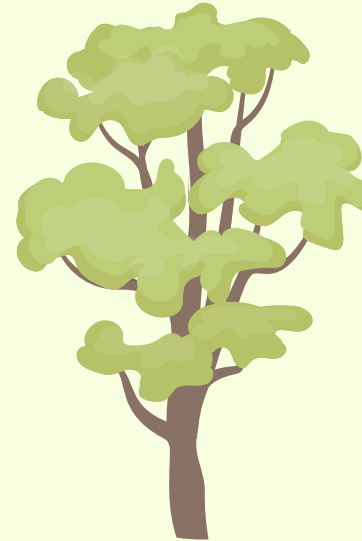
★ 2016 - Final Lost Pines Recovery, total of 45,000 trees planted over 5 years

★ 2019 - Largest Replant day planting 748 trees

★ 2020 - First large covid safe student gathering

★ 2021 - Planted on campus for the 1st time

★ 2022- Planted at the most amount of sites — 32 sites





What do we do?



- Every fall we plant trees around the Bryan and College Station community
- Usually 500-700 trees
 - Most popular varieties
 - Live Oak
 - Pecan
 - Crape Myrtle
- Planting goal for this year: 1000 trees!!!!!!
- How far do we plant from campus?
